Can you believe it's already June with Field Day around the corner? Field Day is June 23rd and 24th this year. It is always one of the more enjoyable events of the Ham Radio year. This month's meeting will be devoted to Field Day planning and logistics. Once again Bruce, W6OSP, and the Field Day planning committee have already done lots of work to insure that this year's event will once again be successful. The Field Day committee has everything in place to facilitate a fine effort this year and as always, we need as many hands as possible for setup and take down.

Marin was where I first experienced Field Day back in 1974 as a newly licensed novice. My elmer, W6FQS invited me to join the Marin Amateur Radio Club at the Boy Scout's Camp Tamarancho near Fairfax, Ca. I remember the thrill of working SSB and CW through the evening hours. Invite your friends or family down to experience what Field Day is all about. Who knows maybe it will spark an interest.



For those who missed it (and for those who were there), Bob Wilson's (N6TV) excellent presentation to the May REDXA meeting was an informative talk on using the Reverse Beacon Network. We learned how to use the RBN to check our antennas and how to improve our chances of breaking a skimmer generated pileup. Additionally, we were shown how we can easily be spotted and how we could improve our contest scores using the RBN. In summary, his recommendations are to use computer generated CW to make sure the skimmers copy you; call spots a little off frequency to break the pileups and only monitor skimmers within your geographical area, plus any spots of yourself. You can call CQ on CW, check the RBN, rotate the antenna and repeat and you can compare signal levels received by the RBN. Many thanks go out to Bob for the great presentation. We appreciate his making the long trip up from San Jose.

I'm still looking for a program for August, let me know if you have any ideas. Looking forward, September will be a special CQP presentation by club members. Several members have participated in County Expeditions over the years in CQP. We'll have a presentation of REDXA CQP expeditions through the years and also rally the membership to participate in CQP 2012. We can also discuss ways to maximize our points for another run at the CQP club competition. The club had a tremendous effort last year and fell just shy of winning the club competition. We can win the CQP club award, it is well within reach. Did you know the CQP Club Competition plaque has been sponsored for many, many years by REDXA?

I'm looking forward to next month as REDXA, MLDXCC and the NCCC will have a joint meeting on Saturday, July 28th. Contesting

CQWW WPX CW is now in the logs. 15 meters was the place to be, which seemed to be open all through Saturday night. The results on 3830 show 15 meters was the workhorse band for most stations.

Alan, K6SRZ posted an impressive score in the CQ WW WPX CW contest. He piloted his home station using the call KY0W, cranking out 2072 Q's and close to 4.7 million points in 34 hours. He says his DXCC count for the contest was 108. Alan mentions "DX summit shows 22 spots for KY0W, almost all on 15 meters--it's been a long time since the band was in such good shape. On the other hand, 80 meters, which is arguably my strongest band from Penngrove was mostly a waste of time." He says "it's been a long time since I have QSYed to improve my rate from 80 back to 15 in the middle

of the night!" He made over 1000 Q's on 15 meters alone.

Al, K6RIM handed out the rare K6 prefix and had a great time while logging close to 1.8 million points in just over 23 hours of operating. 15 meters was also his money band, he said it was "unbelievable, open late PM into EU, Middle East, etc. Wow!" It doesn't get much better... DX and CW... Perfect!

John, K6MM joined in on the fun as AK6M. He made over 1300 Q's and 2.1 million points in 30 hours of operating. His soapbox reads like this. "Yes, dear, I'll be there soon". "Pull weeds? "Sure. Just a few more minutes".

Closed the shack door, called CQ and 30 hours later found over 1300 Qs and 2M+ points in the Log -- a personal best for me in this one." He states conditions were awesome on 15 meters and 20 meters stayed open all night.

Ron, N6IE experienced the great propagation using the call WQ6K. He managed 896 Q's and over 1.2 million points in over 20 hours of operating. Ron did manage to get in on the spectacular conditions Friday night and most of Saturday during the day. He said "Friday night, I was copying EU on short path and long path at the same time, and I kept receiving my own last "dit" via around the world skip. He also states "15 and 20 were amazing!"

Field Day while not really a "Contest" probably draws out more hams and potential hams than any other ham radio related event. Further, it attempts to show off all the various aspects of ham radio. This year we will be operating 2A plus 6 meters. Our own 6 meter guru Bob, K6QXY will mentor us with the details of the magic band.

The club will use N1MM contest logging software again this year. You can familiarize yourself by visiting their web page and watching the N1MM video tutorials.

Another good tutorial is under "Documents" then select "Quick Start Guide".

We look forward to seeing you at Field Day.

VK0H, HEARD ISLAND. Dated May 15th: "After 5 months of planning, Cordell Expeditions is pleased to announce a DXpedition to Heard Island, Territory of Australia, in early 2014. We have assembled a core team, arranged for the vessel, and are awaiting the landing permit and radio callsign. Initial team members, collaborating organizations, and other resources will be announced in the near future. The expedition will be multi-disciplinary, with three major activities: Communications, Environmental Science, and Documentation. We will be active on all bands and all modes, implement a variety of innovative real-time communications technologies, and field a variety of scientific projects that are designed to observe and document some of the unique resources on this extraordinary island. We will use the latest version of DXA (www.cordell.org/DXA) for real-time online presentation of log data, images, and video from Heard Island.

This project follows the very successful expedition to Heard Island carried out by this group in 1997. Details of that operation can be seen at www.cordell.org/HI. The website for the 2014 DXpedition is www.cordell.org/HD.

We invite your participation in this project, as a potential team member, supporter, or eventually as a callsign in our radio log! If you have a particular interest in Heard Island or may be interested in joining the expedition, we invite you to contact us.

You can submit your QSL Card request direct or via the bureau. Each will be responded too in a timely manner. In saying this, it takes a lot more time to process the manual requests. In order to provide an expedited QSL service, here are a few adjustments that we are making to our website (www.yemen2012.com):

- Adding PayPal payment for electronic QSL Card confirmations. No need to send QSL cards, once you “valid date and time” of your QSO’s online and make a payment, these cards will be sent out first.
- Adding key space for major sponsors to the website

We want to thank the DX Community for their hard work, patience and willingness in making this DX-pedition a major success. We are all on our way home at this time.

Field Day Directions

This month is Field Day. If you are planning to come operate or help set-up or tear-down, please make sure you let us know so we can plan the event. We need help to get the towers up Friday afternoon. Much of the set-up will be identical to last year so we will have a speedier time of it. We can still use more help.

From San Rafael and points north:

-- Take Hwy 101 south to the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge. Turn on 580 toward Richmond. Just before 2 miles, take the last exit before the bridge.

(Francisco Blvd) If you miss the turn, you will cross the bridge and pay a toll to return. At the stop sign, cross under the freeway, and turn left at the "T" at the end.

-- **From East Bay**, take the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge and exit the first off ramp on the Marin side.

-- **From south Marin**, the Larkspur turn off over to 580 and then take the last exit before the bridge.

(Francisco Blvd) If you miss the turn, you will cross the bridge and pay a toll to return. At the stop sign, cross under the freeway, and turn left at the "T" at the end.

To re-cap. We will be operating 2A with an additional 6 meter station from the Marin Rod and Gun Club right on the bay. This is a great site and we should do very well.

Set up will begin at 11 AM sharp on June 22nd. We need all the help we can get. The contest starts at 11 AM on Saturday June 23rd and is over Sunday at 11 AM. There should be plenty of operating time.
